
Archetype Brewing Company will host a Montford Neighborhood Oktoberfest party September 14. Maybe we could call it "Mon-toberfest"?

Bear sightings in Montford

If you read the Montford Listserve you know there is an increase in black bear sighting in our neighboorhood, however, it is not just a local occurrence. North Carolina's human population is increasing and many new homes are built in occupied bear range each year. Due to the adaptable nature of bears and improved management by wildlife agencies, black bear populations are increasing and bear range is expanding in North Carolina. As a result, bears and people are coming into contact with each other more frequently. Many citizens of North Carolina wish to see bears continue to thrive in the state. The challenge is to learn how problems with bears can be avoided in residential areas that are in or near bear habitat.

The black bear is the only bear species found in North Carolina or anywhere in the eastern United States. The successful comeback of the American black bear in North Carolina represents one of wildlife management's greatest achievements. Black bears were once restricted to remote areas and reached very low population levels in the mid-1900s. Today, black bears are found approximately 60% of the total land area of North Carolina.







Item, Summary and Action

72 Woodlawn Avenue—After the fact approval request to regrade area of yard adjacent to driveway and construct a 24" tall stone retaining wall; install new concrete pad adjacent to rear elevation.

Action—Approved with Conditions

30 Cumberland Avenue—nstallation of 16.25 square foot, HDU free-standing sign in front yard. **Action**—Approved

26 Courtland Avenue—After the fact approval request to modify front entry stair/landing and install stone patio at front elevation.

Action—Continued

23/27 Elizabeth Place—Demolish existing onestory, 500 square foot primary structure. Construct two (2) three-story, 9,850 square foot multi-family structures. **See Photos below**.

Action—Continued

57 Cumberland Avenue—Construction of splitrail fence along southern property boundary.

Action—Approved

24 Elizabeth Place—Modifications to existing structure, including modification of front entry stair, installation of new door and window on front facade, replacement of one door and two windows on rear elevation with new double-hung windows and installation of new mechanical equipment.

Action—Approved with Conditions

70 Flint Street—Construction of 1,144 square foot, one-and-a-half story accessory structure.
