

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The Montford & Stumptown Fund of the Asheville-Buncombe Community Land Trust (ABCLT):

Investing in Black Homeownership

Editor's note: The Montford Community Club is a new group (named after one from the 1970s-80s), and not the Montford Neighborhood Association. This article is abbreviated, read the full piece at montford and stumptown.com.

Last summer yard signs popped up along Elizabeth Street to Pearson Drive to Westover to Cumberland, and all along Montford Avenue--Black Lives Inspire. We Are All In This Together. Black Lives Matter. As the call for

racial justice swept the nation, house after house declared, "We're in." Now, we have the opportunity to turn those words into action.

Through resident-led

efforts, the Montford & Stumptown Fund has been established with the Asheville-Buncombe Community Land Trust (ABCLT) with the goal of creating and protecting permanently affordable housing for Black people in Montford and Stumptown. This fund is designed to help repair





the damage caused by centuries of racial inequities in real estate.

This is an invitation for Montford residents' to acknowledge the past and actively work for a more just future. This spring, the fund is actively accepting donations.

Consider donations of all types and sizes:

- Donations of a portion of the equity you've built as property values have increased
- Donations of a percent of profits from the sale of a home
- Donations of a percent of real estate commissions
- Donations of a percent of AirBnB/vacation rental fees
- Donations of a percent of B&B rental fees
- Donations of a percent of long term rental fees
- Donations of a percent of business sales
- Donations of a percent of neighborhood tours
- Donations of real estate
- Spreading the word about the fund to your neighbors

What can you give?

The kickoff fundraising goal is \$557,000--the median cost of a home in Montford.

Funds will go towards the purchase of land and all or part of homes for Black families (either existing or new construction). Each family will own their home outright and lease the land from the ABCLT (which will remain "in trust" for the benefit of the community). There will be a resale formula for shared equity based on the increased value of the home at the time of sale. Funds raised can also be used to help protect ongoing homeownership of legacy Black neighbors. A committee of Black current/ former Montford and Stumptown residents and ABCLT board members will make the final decisions on how the fund is invested.

Our target date to meet this goal is June 2022. To donate, go to abclt.org (there is an option to designate a gift to the Montford & Stumptown Fund), or mail a check to ABCLT, 825 Merrimon Ave. Ste C, PMB #141, Asheville, NC 28804, with "Montford & Stumptown Fund" in the note section.



This is a long-term effort initiated by the Montford Community Club and designed to shift who lives and owns homes in Montford. If you would like to join us as a founding donor or as a neighborhood advocate, we would love to have you! Please contact ABCLT Executive Director Anna Zeuvskaya (anna@abclt.org) and let us know how you're interested in participating and a few sentences about your relationship to Montford and to racial justice.

Green Corner Mitch Russell

For March of this year, I wrote an article on ways to protect our feathered friends from our feline fur babies. Based on the way my pup lunges after birds should have included at least her if not all dogs!



I mentioned that I would be giving dogs equal time so here goes.

Le poop. Dogs do it and most of us pick it up, but sometimes we don't and that's a problem for several reasons. It gets on the bottom of our shoes or feet, it's odiferous and it's not good for our waterways.

In urban areas, fecal counts in waterways can be quite high just from dog excrement. I worked for Rivers Alive in Georgia, which is similar to the Big Sweep here in organizing and providing data from waterway cleanups.



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When I wasn't organizing, crunching numbers, or one of many other job-related tasks I was giving presentations, attending enviro fairs at schools, businesses or teaching Adopt-A-Stream protocols, so I was already familiar with a good bit of the info in this article. However...., when I researched Asheville's particulars I found some fascinating tidbits through the websites of Buncombe County Parks and Recreation and Pet Poo Skiddoo, Eco Pet Waste Removal. There are approximately 23,559 dogs in Asheville that produce almost 6.5 million pounds of poo! Magical formulas are provided on Pet Poo.... website. That equals about 720 average male African elephants or for something more tangible and that doesn't create feces it would equal roughly the same weight as 2,130 Priuses or Prii if you prefer. Holy s*** that's a lot of squatting dogs!! So what's the big deal since birds, squirrels, rabbits, bears, etc also poop. True, but not in the same magnitude as dogs and we can't pick up their feces like we can our dog's. The main issue with dog excrement is that it can be highly toxic to aquatic species in the form of bacteria, 23 million parts per gram to be precise based on EPA data, nitrogen, and phosphorus. Nitrogen and phosphorus lead to less oxygen in water and raise the level of ammonia, both of which can lead to aquatic species dying. Even if left in our yards the poo will enter the aquifer and still make its way into waterways. Luckily our drinking water sources are east and south of Asheville.

So the next time Rover makes a poo be sure to pick it up and be a enviro hero and pick up any that didn't get picked up by other dog parents.
