

The Birthday House

Come inside the homes that you admire from the outside! Here's a small sample of the jewels you'll see.

The Art Deco Estate

From the outside, this prominent residence is notable for its curvilinear, "eyebrow" tiled roof. But local legend has it that the inside has served as a genuine Prohibition-era speakeasy and social club. Picture young debutants making their entrance down the lovely staircase in the 1920's and 30's. A large bar rumored to be from the original Battery Park Hotel, is located in the basement and will be restored.

The Name Dropper

This lovely stone home boasts connections to Asheville's most prominent citizens. In 1918 E.W. Grove (Grove Park Inn) purchased

the property. A.M. Griffing (Griffing Rose Garden) bought the newly built home for \$50,000 in 1926. The home designer was Charles Parker (architect of the Grove Arcade) and the builder was W.J. Jackson Construction (builders of the first skyscraper in Asheville, the Jackson Building). This home is located near St. Mary's Episcopal Church where the "church ladies" have drinks and sandwiches for purchase.

The Birthday House

Come celebrate the 100th birthday of this prairie style house designed by Richard Sharpe Smith. The diamond-shaped living room windows, coal fireplaces, and hardwood floors are just some of the original elements that remain. Although a middle class home, the servants' floor bell in the dining room floor made it easy to summon servants from the basement.

Outside, a remnant of the Asheville street car route separates the back yard from Macon Avenue neighbors.

There is also a jaw-dropping modern stunner you don't want to miss!

North Carolina Banjo Clinic Coming to Montford

The North Carolina Banjo Clinic will be coming to Montford **Friday, November 13 and Saturday, November 14**.

The NCBC is an intensive two-day banjo instruction event. Group classes start at 9am and end at 4:30pm each day. All teachers are either semi- or full-time professional players and instructors. We will offer both bluegrass and old time banjo instruction.

Cost

Early-bird registration for both days is \$275 until October 1. The price after October 1 is \$295. Registration for one day only is \$150.

We will also offer banjo setup (Saturday only) and private after-clinic hours one-on-one instruction, though there are usually ample opportunities to seek individual instruction during the clinic.







Duke Energy Update

Update from Jimmy Flythe, Duke Energy Regional Director of Community Relations

While the development of the Hill Street Substation is still on hold, Duke started cleaning up the site the week of August 10.

Jimmy Flythe, Duke Energy Regional Director of Community Relations, says this is absolutely no indication that we are starting to build on this site. The work is needed to be a good neighbor and better secure the property.

There is a lot of trash and undergrowth on the site. Our security personnel and the Asheville Police determined that clearing the undergrowth will make it easier for police to see inside the area and keep trespassers off. This will also improve the appearance. It's a large lot and it's very overgrown, so it is a fairly large amount of work.

Isaac Dickson Construction

About a week after Duke began the cleanup, Isaac Dickson started construction on the new school, which is slated to be finished the end of January 2016.


When City Council understands that most residents want to save a little space for trees during this building boom, we believe they will preserve that land and the view of the church.

My front porch is set up with Yard Signs and Petition boards. There is also a box of Yard Signs on the front steps available to anyone anytime and will remain there until the elections are over.




