

Minutes Montford Neighborhood Association (MNA) Quarterly Community Meeting

Odyssey School, Wednesday, September 6, 2024

President Randy Hall welcomed everyone to our delayed quarterly meeting at 6:30 PM at Odyssey School, 90 Zillicoa St.

Public Safety

Asheville Police Dept. Community Resource Officer Carrie Lee reported that since our last meeting on July 25, in Montford, there have been these crimes reported:

- 4 auto thefts
- 11 thefts of items from automobiles
- 8 other thefts
- 4 residential breaking and entering
- 1 business breaking and entering
- 2 indecent exposures
- 3 assaults
- 7 damage to property
- 1 communicating threat or road rage
- 1 gun discharge

The police department has provided 20 hours of crime prevention activities for residents during this period.

Carrie also let us know that the police and fire departments have received great support in the aftermath of Hurricane Helene from other jurisdictions. This included work by 96 first responder teams and a number of commercial drone companies.

The police department has just reorganized its districts. Montford will be included in the northern district and will have a new community resource officer, Isaiah Zensak.

Neighborhood Services

Neighborhood Services Specialist Trey Irby reported that the removal of debris from the Hurricane Helene storm is moving into high gear. The City of Asheville has three centers set up to handle the waste. The centers are set up to process the waste and make it ready for permanent disposal sites by:

- Inspecting and tracking the waste,
- Grinding vegetative debris,
- Compacting bulky debris, and
- Containing household hazardous waste that happens to get through.

Hazardous waste is not generally allowed. These centers can only be used by contractors who have been hired by the city, not privately hired contractors. More detail on these operations can be found at www.ashevillenc.gov/helene/debris-removal.

Preservation Society of Asheville & Buncombe County (PSABC)

PSABC Executive Director Jessie Landl provided general information about the organization and invited neighbors to utilize their services -- which apply to any structure more than 50 years old. They now have five staff people with expertise on both the physical process of preserving and upgrading historic buildings, and on regulations and support programs for historic preservation. Preservation grants are available for working on building and getting approved as a historic structure. They now do survey work to identify historic structures and are seeking volunteers to help.

In addition to technical assistance, PSABC offers grants to home owners who want to launch historic preservation projects on their properties. These grants have grown in size over the years. They now have a special fund to assist in recovery from Helene storm damage. They would be willing to help fund the restoration of historic retaining walls, but not until they get through the Helene relief awards.

MNA Financial Report

MNA Treasurer Susan Eggerton reported that the current fund balance of the association is \$53,899.58 and expense are running below budget for the year. Reed Creek Greenway Update (Kudzu)

Susan Eggerton reported that work continues to manage the Kudzu infestation on the Reed Creek Greenway. Two hour work parties will be held on Saturday 11/16 and Sunday 12/1. Details will follow on the Montford Listserv.

Garden Tour Update

Board member Lynn Raker reported that home owners have been recruited to share their gardens. The tour will take place on Saturday, June 7. Ticket sales have been an important fund raiser for our association, bringing in over \$16,000 last year. More details will be coming.

Holiday Tour of Homes

Canceled this year due to the Helene storm.

Montford Lights Holiday Celebration

Board member Marti Boyles reported that all preparations have been made. The Montford Players will not be performing due to Helene's disruption, but all other program participants have agreed to participate. It will start at 4:30 on Saturday, December 7. Everyone will assemble at the parking lot behind the Tempe Avery Center and then parade to the Montford Garden Park behind the Asheville High School Drumline for a lighting of the Christmas tree and Menorah, and singing of songs. Our thanks to the Smart Fellers company for hanging huge Christmas balls from the trees.

New Business from the Floor

When no one raised any new business, President Randy Hall adjourned the meeting at 7:50 PM.

COA Community Upfit Project Update

Four months ago I applied for a grant from the COA on behalf of Odyssey School (and MNA indirectly) as a site for the Community Upfit Program, funded by federal American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA.) The project is designed to help communities improve communication, strengthen community ties and improve climate resilience.

The Odyssey School was awarded \$7500.00. Technological improvements will enhance on-site and remote learning capabilities for the school as well as meeting capabilities for the Montford community at large.



As we move into the holiday season during such a challenging time for the region, it is more important than ever for our community that we try



to focus on supporting local businesses. Fortunately, there can be <u>many environmental and social sustainability</u> <u>benefits inherent to shopping local</u>, from supporting local jobs and community investment to often having a lower carbon footprint.

If you know what they'd love, buy it local. Or buy a gift card so they can pick something out themselves or can online if they don't live locally.

Here are a few places to help with your planning:

- Love Asheville Go Local Database Not only does buying a Go Local card get you discounts that payback immediately, but funds go to support Asheville public schools and their database includes a variety of amazing filtering criteria, from business type to environmental or social attributes. This database is not post-Helene specific, so check with businesses first that they are open.
- Explore Asheville from Afar Database A great compilation for non-locals to also do shopping to support regional businesses and artists.
- <u>Shop WNC</u> Information on how to support regional businesses, restaurants, and artists, beyond just Asheville.

In addition to buying restaurant gift cards as presents, you can also consider offloading some of the holiday cooking burden, by checking which local restaurants, bakers, and caterers are offering holiday meals for dine in or takeout.

Or if cooking is a key part of the tradition, try to get your ingredients from a farmer's market (see here post-Helene farmer's market information), local farmer, or regional growers, like those often sourced from at French Broad Co-op. Local food can be one of the best ways to reduce your footprint.

For physical gifts, when possible look for items made with reusable, durable, repairable, recycled, renewable, compostable, and/ or recyclable attributes or materials.
