### **Montford Gardens to Inspire Local Artists in June**

Spring has sprung, and I'm delighted to see our yards coming alive with color again.

Montford is blessed not only with avid gardeners and splendid gardens, but also with generous neighbors who share their gardens with the public during the annual Historic Montford Garden Tour in June.


The 2025 garden tour will include an exciting new activity — artists plein air painting at each featured garden. Each artist will work their magic for two to three hours, capturing a scene in or around the tour gardens. The final works will be shared on the garden tour website and will be available for purchase through the artist.

A bit of history: plein air painting, from the French "en plein air" ("in fresh air"), began in the early 1800s. The practice became increasingly popular through the 19 th century, enabled by the invention of portable canvases and easels and paints in tubes. Impressionist painters like Monet, Renoir, and Pissarro were drawn to plein air painting to better see and convey the effects of light on the landscape, and to capture the changing details of weather and time of day. With the expansion of plein air painting came the rise of impressionistic, naturalistic, and expressive landscape painting — a break from the stylized, romantic landscapes of the old masters.

Today, plein air painting is widely popular with both artists and collectors. Many art instructors utilize this practice, which is credited with helping artists learn the effects of light on the landscape. Accomplished plein air artists come together for informal "paint outs" and regional and national competitions. Art collectors have embraced the unique freshness, energy and evocativeness of plein air-based works, whether completed in onsite or finished in the studio.

We are fortunate to have some of the region's best artists painting during this year's Montford Garden Tour! These seasoned painters represent a variety of media, styles and perspectives. The participating artists are: Bee Adams (acrylic) Sue Dolamore (oils), Cheryl Keefer (oils), Mitch Kolbe (oil), Donny Luke (watercolor), Sandra Brugh Moore (watercolor), Claire Simpson Jones (watercolor), and Anne Strutz (pastel). More information about the artists and a link to their websites will be posted on the Montford Garden Tour website in April.

The 2025 Historic Montford Garden Tour takes place Saturday, June 7, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., rain or shine. For this month's Green Corner, we are interviewing another one of our wonderful local, sustainabilityminded businesses who could use your support!



Our third feature is Karmen with <u>Sew AVL</u>, located downtown at 56 S Lexington Ave Unit 101, Asheville, NC 28801.

### Q: What is the origin story of Sew AVL?

A: It started by being part of staff at The Marquee in the River Arts District. The owner Robert Nichols invited staff (many of whom were makers or artists) sell their work at the Marquee. I wanted to take part in the opportunity. I started making planters out of vintage tins to start with but when my mom gave me her sewing machine I switch to upcycling apparel.

### Q: What kinds of services do you offer?

A: I offer custom upcycling (bring anything you'd like to rework, refashion or freshen up with applique, patches or combining with something else. I also love taking vintage textiles ie sheets, blankets, table clothes and turning them into apparel, bags or hats. I offer mending, alterations, creative workshops, and private beginner sewing classes

### Q: Do you also sell any products?

A: Yes! I sell tops and jackets I have sewn applique onto. I also have small-batch hats made from pre-loved textiles.

# **Q**: Any favorite customer interactions or stories?

A: Once a young lady with lots of tattoos came in the shop. She was wearing a plain shirt and I offered to sew an applique on it--explaining that applique is like

"tattoos for apparel." She said "Oh no! Not my shirt!" It struck me as humorous that her shirt was more precious than her skin!

# Q: How did the hurricane impact your business?

A: The hurricane was emotionally tough for me. My craft is playful, sometimes humorous—the way I combine things can be silly and fun. It's definitely whimsical! I lost all of my light-heartedness after the storm. It was hard to get in a creative mood until the collective sense of loss mellowed. Physically downtown was hardly phased besides loss of water. Thank goodness the heart of town kept pulsing!

### **Theatrical Performance**


