If you haven't stopped by the Botanic Garden lately, you're in for some surprises! The flagstone patio in front of the visitors center/gift shop is



completed and awaiting some plantings around the edges and eventually some chairs and tables to rest after your garden stroll. You'll be able to enjoy a cold beverage from local supplier Devil's Foot Beverage Company. My personal favorite is the refreshing strawberry lemonade, perfect on a hot summer afternoon!

The peace and quiet has finally returned now that the cicadas have finished mating and disappeared back underground for another 17 years. The cacophony was quite amazing, and our most common question from June visitors was "What is that horrible high-pitched





TO JOIN THE LISTSERVE sound?" Meanwhile, our feathered friends were happily feasting on the carcasses scattered conveniently in the bird garden. We also have a transient mama bear and her single cub who were spotted resting in the shade off the trail. Mama was getting a much-needed nap while her youngster nursed. Guests were thrilled to witness the little family scene, and everyone kept a respectful distance.

The June bloom cycle is in full swing, and the common names sound as if we raided the reptile house at the zoo: Rattlesnake Master (Eryngium), Lizard's Tail (Saururus), and Turtlehead (Chelone). The large pink flower heads of common milkweed surrounded by its leathery leaves are a common sight. Stop and inspect the leaves for this plant's famous resident, the black, yellow and white striped caterpillar of the Monarch butterfly. The Monarch caterpillar feeds exclusively on milkweed, and, if you're lucky, you might find one dangling in a J-shape from a woody stem which indicates they are about to form the beautiful bright green chrysalis from which, in about 14 days, the butterfly will emerge. Should you find one, please don't touch or disturb it. We're trying our best to help these beautiful creatures survive. Photos of this miracle of nature are a wonderful souvenir of your visit.

And, finally, come and admire our newly reconstructed gazebo in the Sunshine Meadow. The woodwork and design is reflective of the serene natural setting and is the perfect spot for an intimate wedding, renewal of vows or just sittin' for a spell!





Green Corner Erin Hiatt

For this month's Green Corner, we are interviewing another one of our wonderful local, sustainabilityminded businesses that could use your support!

Our fifth feature is Kim Rosas with Period Nirvana, located in West Asheville at 315 Haywood Rd, Suite 113, Asheville, NC 28806.

Q: What is the origin story of Period Nirvana?

A: I started using a menstrual cup in 2012, and it was a life-changing switch for me. That experience led me to overshare on the Internet about cups, which turned into my career as an expert educator on the subject. Period Nirvana began as an online website that focused on educational content about period care options. We also sold reusable period care products at our e-commerce store. My passion has always been in-person education, and opening a physical location was a far-fetched dream. In 2024, I decided to go for it, and we opened in April 2025 after nearly a year of design planning and buildout.

Q: What range of products do you offer?

A: At our West Asheville location, we specialize in reusable period products - menstrual cups and menstrual discs, cloth pads, reusable period underwear in XXS-5X, and related accessories like cleaning products. We also carry organic tampons and pads. We also offer things you'd expect at a store for people with a uterus - postpartum items, pregnancy tests, morning after pills, teas for menstrual wellness, period pain relief, books, plus fun, giftable items. We also have a free museum exhibit in the store that features 100 years of menstrual technology. It's been a big hit so far!

Q: What are your most popular products and your favorite products personally?

A: Our most popular items are the Hello Disc - a one-

size menstrual disc that I co-designed- and Saalt Wear leakproof boyshorts. I use a Hello Disc for my own periods, and it's my favorite item in the store, but I am also obsessed with the vulva themed pouch and gift wrap we carry.

Q: Any favorite customer interactions or stories?

A: In the month we have been open, there have been lots of memorable interactions - moms coming in to build their child a first-period kit are probably my favorite. The experience of coming to a safe space like ours, where we freely talk about menstruation, and building a kit with or for their child is very healing. A lot of cycle breaking and inner child healing happen,s and it's a privilege to be part of that.

Q: Where can readers follow you or stay up to date?


